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INDEPENDENT PRACTITIONER'S REVIEW ENGAGEMENT REPORT

To: The board of directors of Lethbridge Sport Council

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of Lethbridge Sport Council that comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2023, and the statements of operations, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the accompanying financial statements based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements, which require us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements is a limited assurance engagement. The practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making inquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less in extent than, and vary in nature from, those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these financial statements.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial statements do not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Lethbridge Sport Council as at December 31, 2023, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

For the year ended December 31, 2023

1. Nature of operations

Lethbridge Sport Council is a not-for-profit organization incorporated under the Societies Act of Alberta. The purpose of the Society is to support the enhancement and development of sport within the Lethbridge community.

2. Significant accounting policies

These financial statements are prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. The significant accounting policies are detailed as follows:

(a) Revenue recognition

The Society follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

(b) Cash and cash equivalents

The Society includes cash on hand and amounts held by financial institutions in operating accounts in the determination of cash and cash equivalents.

(c) Capital assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost. The Society provides for amortization using the declining balance method at rates designed to amortize the cost of the capital assets over their estimated useful lives. The annual amortization rates are as follows:

Furniture and fixtures	20%
Computer equipment	30%
Computer software	30%

(d) Financial instruments

The Society initially measures its financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value. The Society subsequently measures its financial assets and financial liabilities at amortized cost.

(e) Measurement uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reported period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(f) Income taxes

Under Section 149(1)(I) of the Income Tax Act, the Society is exempt from income taxes on income earned in the normal course of business.

(g) Contributed services

Volunteers contributed time to assist the Society in carrying out its programs. Because of the difficulty of determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

Short-term investments consist of four rewriteable GICs with interest rates from 3.75% to 5.35% and maturity dates from May 2024 to November 2025.
